

CORONAVIRUS ISE Regulations & Protocols

Updated October 2022

ISE PRIORITIES

- to continue to implement expectations regarding health and hygiene that follow the [government guidelines](#) and expectations of the RIVM.
- to adhere to strict health expectations for parents and other non-staff when they are on the school campus

EXPECTATIONS FOR STAFF & STUDENTS

The Coronavirus remains, and as a community we must stay alert and do our best to contain infections. We therefore expect everyone to continue to be mindful of good health and hygiene practices.

- Staff and students will practice good personal hygiene habits including frequent hand washing, coughing and sneezing into the elbow, and not touching their faces
- Staff will regularly remind students about expectations for health and hygiene
- Staff and students will continue to limit physical contact with each other by not giving high fives, handshakes or hugs.
- Staff and students who have cold-like symptoms are expected to remain at home and take a self-test. If the self-test is negative, staff and students can return to school. If the self-test is positive, staff and students must remain at home and quarantine Please refer to the government [advice](#).
- Staff and students do not need to quarantine and may come to school if they have been in close contact with people, including members of the same household, who have tested positive for the coronavirus, as long as they don't have symptoms.

FACE MASKS

- Face masks no longer need to be worn at school.
- Students and staff may naturally wear a face mask if they wish.

SOCIAL DISTANCING

- The 1.5 metre distance regulation no longer applies however we will continue to respect others if they wish to keep their distance.

AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

- All after school activities in the primary and secondary departments have restarted.

PARENTS ON CAMPUS

Regulations changes mean that parents are now allowed on the school campus. We are delighted that we will finally be able to allow parents back on the school campus.

Below we have outlined the various steps we are taking to welcome you back.

- Parents are able to be on the school campus to drop off and pick up their children.
- Parents are able to be in the school buildings and may visit the canteen until 10:30 and after 14:00 each day. Due to the growth in student numbers, unfortunately, we cannot accommodate parents in the canteen during the student break times between 10:45 and 14:00.
- Parent seminars, workshops and information sessions may take place in person at school.
- Parent-Teacher meetings will be able to be held at school.
- Coffee mornings, bake sales and school merchandise sales will be possible.
- Parents will be able to join in the celebrations at the Group 7 & 8 leaving ceremony and DP2 graduation.

SELF TESTS

- Students and staff are no longer expected to self test twice a week. However, to protect our community we recommend that both students and staff self-test if they are concerned that they may have been infected by the coronavirus.
- The school will no longer provide students with self-tests.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU HAVE BEEN IN CONTACT WITH SOMEONE WHO HAS TESTED POSITIVE FOR THE CORONAVIRUS.

Staff and students do not need to quarantine and may come to school if they have been in close contact with people, including members of the same household, who have tested positive for the coronavirus, as long as they don't have symptoms.

If there are several infections in a group over a period of time, the GGD will conduct an outbreak investigation. In that case, the GGD can still advise to quarantine the entire group.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU HAVE TESTED POSITIVE FOR THE CORONAVIRUS

- If you test positive after a self-test or PCR test for the Coronavirus, you must self isolate at home. Even if you are protected against (immune) to the coronavirus.
- The municipal health service (GGD) will tell you how long to isolate for and what rules apply.
- Stay apart from the people you live with as much as possible.
- You may return to school after a minimum of **5 days** have passed after the start of your symptoms and after **24 hours** have passed without having any symptoms associated with corona. If your symptoms continue, you may end your isolation after **10 days**.
- You may not have had any symptoms when you tested positive, and you may not develop symptoms at all. In such cases, the quarantine period lasts 5 days, counting from the day on which you tested positive. If you do develop symptoms that could indicate COVID-19 while you are isolating at home, a new isolation period starts, counting from the date on which your symptoms started.

RECOMMENDATIONS AFTER YOU LEAVE QUARANTINE

When you leave quarantine please be mindful until **10 days have passed since your symptoms started or since your test date.**

- Try as much as possible to stay 1.5 metres from people outside your own household.
- Remember the hygiene measures.
- Anyone over the age of 13 years is recommended to wear a face mask especially if they cannot keep 1.5 metres from others.

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ONLINE LESSONS

Although we understand that there may be several students who need to remain at home due to quarantining because they have tested positive for coronavirus, the school is unable to provide live streaming or online lessons for students who are at home.

Primary teachers will provide tasks for primary students.

Secondary students are expected to refer to Managebac where all tasks are posted. Year Tutors will be informed and will ensure students have the information to be able to continue learning. Alternative arrangements for tests or sharing of resources will be done when necessary.

Secondary teachers who are not sick, but have to quarantine at home will, in most cases, teach their lessons online. Students will be informed and provided with the google links via Managebac.
